

<u>Director: Sebastian Bolenius</u> Lisbon, Portugal

'Home' is a song by the Lisbon-based band JACARANDÁ, whose music has it's roots in the original delta blues, characterized by its simple raw and repetitive approach, trance-like rhythm and the belief in the power of music to confront, heal, and bring people together.

The lyrics are inspired by Australian aboriginal poet Big Bill Neidjie, and his poem "Story about feeling". It reflects on the deep symbiotic connection we can experience with "the land" and the natural world, through physical and spiritual means.

Filmed in the Serra of Sintra, Portugal, the video explores this connection, as we follow a man wandering alone in a forest. He may be on a shamanic ritual or simply dreaming, and the surrounding land guides him on a journey, through space and time, from molecular to macroscopic level), leading to the realisation that he and the land are one.

At a time where Humanity is at risk from our disconnected way of life, 'Home' is a cry to reclaim that

connection, key to our survival. The land will contine to exist regardless.

A KRYSTOF KESHAV FILM





Having his key questions remaining unanswered, he learns simple, yet valuable lessons from these encounters and decides to share them with his followers.

<u>Director: Krystof Keshav</u> Lisbon, Portugal



Krystof Keshav is an independent film maker based in Lisbon, Portugal. As an amateur actor, he found himself working as a figurante in films and adverts across Europe, or acting in short independent films, where he did not have a real say in the synopsis or the final script. When he approached Directors with his own synopsis or script, he found it extremely difficult to have his short film produced. So, falling back on previous courses in photography, film studies and 16mm Film-making, he boot-strapped and became an independent Director.



LifeStrings is a screendance film that investigates climate justice, violins and motherhood using a contemporary flamenco dance vocabulary. Reflecting on traditional Flamenco dance rhythms, techniques, gestures and modes of transmission, the work asks questions about what we copy and imitate and what we disrupt and let go of in terms of traditions. The film is using a choreographic lens to navigate cultural and generational trauma while also relying on the dancing body to reveal embodied histories and practices. Romani Violin playing by the Lautari musicians have a great tradition of violin playing, with virtuosos frequently embroidering their music with extreme amounts of ornamentation. Within Flamenco, the violin is often used to replace the singer and becomes the voice within an accompaniment. LifeStrings

<u>Director: Rosa Cisneros</u> Sheffield, UK



Rosamaria is a dancer and choreographer, Dance Historian and Critic, Roma Scholar, Sociologist, Flamenco Historian and Peace Activist who graduated from UW-Madison and went on to complete her Master's in Dance History and Criticism from UNM-Albuquerque (USA). Her PhD is in Sociology with a focus on Roma women, intersectionality, dialogic feminism and communicative methodologies. Rosamaria is a professional dancer, choreographer, curator and qualified teacher, who has lived and danced in various parts of the world and collaborated with many Flamenco greats and other leaders in the Dance field.

Rosamaria is involved in various EU funded projects which aim to make education accessible to vulnerable groups and ethnic minorities and sits on various Boards: Roma Coventry Project (UK), Drom Kotar Mestipen Roma Women's Association (Spain) and the Early Dance Circle (UK), AWA Dance (UK). At the moment she is an artist-researcher at Coventry University's Centre for Dance Research based in the UK. She is also an independent artist, dancer, curator and teacher who has organised various festivals and exhibitions. Her dance films have screened in the UK, US, Colombia, Mexico, Greece, Cyprus and Germany and her latest documentary won best documentary from the UK in 2016. She has started her own production company, RosaSenCis Film Production Co., which worked on the Society for Dance Research Oral

examines this notion of voice and disrupting traditions while drawing on Roman Krznaric's thinking of the "the good ancestor". Reflecting on The Vaia, a violent storm that tore through the historic Val di Fiemme forest (Italy) in late 2018 and left a trail of devastation, LifeStrings is dedicated to intergenerational justice and long-term thinking. The Vaia storm in 2018, a great atmospheric depression with strong winds, turned Stradivari's forest into a landscape of destruction. Vaia had a dramatic impact in the whole area of the Dolomites, a UNESCO World Heritage site. It caused almost \$3.5 billion worth of damage and knocked down entire forests, destroying 8.5 million cubic meters of wood.

LifeStrings asks....What kind of ancestor do you want to be?

History Project. The company aims to create dance films and documentaries that capture stories and reflect embodied traditions that might otherwise be lost. She has also managed major EU-Funded projects and local City of Culture Partnership projects and organised the Hip Hop Talking Back: artists and researchers events. Rosamaria collaborates closely with the University of Barcelona's Centre for Research on Theories and Practices for Overcoming Inequalities (CREA). She sits on academic Journals as an editor and those include the Journal for Embodied Practices, International Journal of Romani Studies and OneDance UK's HOTFOOT Online magazine.







Webster has created and produced many special events for IDI including two American Public Television specials, two national tours, performances at The Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, Aspen Gay Ski Week, Fenway Park, The National Baseball Hall of Fame, the Fenimore Museum, Rockefeller Center, and Strawbery Banke Museum.

Prior to founding Ice Dance International, Douglas

Webster worked on choreography teams for many major skating companies, including Disney on Ice, Holiday on Ice, Stars on Ice, and The Sun Valley Ice Show. He has served as the Creative Director for a 3-year ABC television series called "Shall We Dance on Ice" and was the Artistic Director of Ice Theatre of New York, staff for US Figure Skating's Dance Camp, High Performance Camp, Synchro Summit, Components Camp, as well as 'Grassroots to Champions' national clinics.




