He began filming only in 2020, when he started off with aftermovies, live recordings, music videos and commercials. In the year 2022 he added this short film and a documentary to his "bucket of experience". His dream is to shoot a feature film in the same genre (crime with a humoristic touch to it).


Monica De Almeida

Spain





One of the darkest aspects of contemporary society: the abuse of power. Starting from the creation of a theatrical show on the theme inspired by a series of Italian news events, the documentary focuses on the possibility of using the theater as a tool for building awareness and critical sense. The reflection crosses the role of media information, the relationship between victim and perpetrator, between oppressed and oppressor, up to addressing a broader reflection on the social system in which we live. The journey inside the show and the perceptions of its participants also offers a cross-section of the condition of independent theater in Italy, and of new methodologies of approach for the dissemination of social issues.

His practice revolves around the concept of limits (of life, of perception, of art, of geography...) as an opportunity to increase consciousness and understanding. He has been a recipient of international art residencies at Selina (Ecuador 2021), Bridgeguard (Slovakia 2020-2021), and Fabrica Research Center (Italy 2015-2018).

From 2002 to 2015 he collaborated with Applicando, for software reviews, tutorials and popular articles in the field of computer graphics and photorealistic simulation.




Tyler Wursta

Portugal





Since then, he made as many shorts as he could possible do. His favorite genre is suspense/horror/sci-fi. In 2017, he decided to make a YouTube channel where he would upload his short films. In the future he has the ambition to become a feature film director.



The music video opens with a couple of women who wake up in a room that we discover gradually installed in the middle of the remains of an abandoned factory. The couple then carry out their daily activities, observed by the singer who tells their story through her performance. The actions take part in a series of exterior 'non-places', natural or dilapidated, where the rooms of a dwelling have been recreated by the dreamlike staging. The intent of the visual concepts for this shift is to reflect some of the effects of the emotionally abusive dynamic between the characters. The clip ends with a separation, as one of them disappears into the darkness and the other returns to bed alone at nightfall.

So, falling back on previous courses in photography, film studies and 16mm Film-making, he boot-strapped and became an independent Director.
